Application Timetable

All applications materials for spring programs must be submitted by December 1. Applications will be accepted as early as July. International students should apply as early as possible in order to apply for a student visa. Applications for the summer program must be submitted by April 15. Admission to the Otterbein Semester does not imply admission to Otterbein University. Students interested in transferring to Otterbein to become a degree seeking student in the semester following their participation in the Otterbein Semester must apply following normal application procedures.

Housing Information

Otterbein Semester students are encouraged to live on-campus. Housing is available, but not guaranteed. Housing preferences for on-campus or off-campus lodging should be communicated when the application is submitted.

Cost

Students who wish to attend the Otterbein Semester pay tuition and fees at levels established especially for this program. Otterbein was founded in 1847 and was among the first universities in the United States to be founded as coeducational and to admit women to the same programs of study as male students. Otterbein was also one of the first three universities in the United States to be open to students of color.

Otterbein University is a comprehensive, private institution and offers both bachelors and masters degrees. Otterbein has a history of community service and engagement and is located in the city of Westerville, a suburb of the state capital of Columbus. In Westerville, it is possible for students to experience the warmth of a small American town located just minutes from the arts and commerce of the 17th largest city in the United States. Storefronts in “Uptown” Westerville are mainly the original architecture and home to many locally owned stores and boutiques. 

Admission Information

Students from colleges and universities abroad are welcome to apply.

International students whose native language is not English, including those applying from a U.S. institution, are required to submit the results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Applicants holding an undergraduate or graduate degree from an academic institution within the United States or another English-speaking country will be exempt from this requirement. Students who wish to improve their English language skills should contact the Otterbein Intensive English Institute at 614-823-1370 or otterbein.abroadoffice.net/iei.

International students should submit the following:

- Completed International Student Application
- Official transcripts from all universities attended
- Bank verification letter
- Applicants whose native language is not English must submit the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or IELTS results
- \$30 application fee payable to Otterbein University

Program Offerings

The Otterbein Semester is open to students from outside the United States who are not seeking degrees at Otterbein. The term of study is limited to two semesters. All courses are taught in English and students need to meet minimum TOEFL requirements. Seats in courses are subject to availability.
