Free Time Activities

You can eat, drink, and spend time with friends between lectures at a number of venues on campus including The Equine Arena Restaurant, The Farm Diner, Penfolds Café, and the main Student Restaurant. Penfolds Café and the main student Restaurant are open throughout the day and in the evening. Legends Bar - a social venue dedicated to Hartpury students - holds weekly events and promotions for college students. Every other week, on your 'studyfree' Wednesday afternoon there are opportunities for sport and recreational activities away from campus, which have previously included bowling, outdoor pursuits, paintballing, and cultural trips.

Travel Requirements

A passport valid for 180 days beyond the last day of the program is required. A visa/entry clearance is required for programs longer than six months. A visa/entry clearance is also required for students planning to participate in an internship program.

Why the Gloucester?


Located about four miles from Hartpury, the City of Gloucester has a unique history from its Roman foundations to its Victorian docklands. The port of Gloucester is a place of great historical importance. Over 2000 years ago, the Romans built a fort which was used for the transport of men and supplies between the Midlands and Wales. Gloucester is a vibrant multicultural city that combines historic architecture with a unique blend of visitor attractions, festivals and entertainment, a collection of specialist shops and a wide array of tea shops, restaurants, bars and pubs. The city is overlooked by the Cotswolds Hills in the lush Severn Valley and is easily accessible from all corners of the country. Independent and regional retailers, many of which are unique to Gloucester, make the city an ideal place to shop.



This program is open to students of junior or senior status who have completed 12 or more Otterbein credits and have a 3.0 GPA.

Housing & Meals

The College provides on-campus accommodations in Halls of Residence as well as off-campus housing in College managed houses located within Gloucester and Newent. Students share a communal kitchen, which is good for socializing and getting to know those students living nearby. A full team of residential wardens is available 24 hours a day to ensure safety and monitor living environments.



Study at Hartpury College

Hartpury is an outstanding provider of courses in equine care, animal science, agricultural and land management, sports science, and food technology. The time that students spend in the classroom is integrated with much time spent in practical situations, be that in the laboratory, the College vard or within a discussion/tutorial group session. The academic team believes that practical instruction is an extremely valuable tool and enhances the learning experience of the students. The Hartpury Equine Academy aims to support and develop high calibre riders seeking to build a competitive career in one of the four Olympic disciplines while continuing their academic education. All students can ride at Hartpury. Over 230 horses are stabled at the College, approximately 75 of which are available for student use in an educational environment.

Academics

Equitation is an optional module on the Equine Science, Equine Sports Science or Equine Business Management undergraduate degrees. Only competent riders (BHS Stage 2 standard or equivalent) will be able to study the equitation module. Hartpury also runs a full calendar of equine shows - affiliated and unaffiliated dressage and show jumping. These competitions are open to student horse owners and the general public, and are very competitive. For outstanding riders, the Equine Academy has been created. This offers the opportunity to receive expert coaching and support while continuing with your education.

Services

Services start on arrival: a pick-up service at the airport is available for new students to help them settle into their accommodations. There is also an orientation to ensure students are confident in both the local setting and the London environment. Additional academic and other services are available to assist students before. during, and after their period of studying abroad.
